# LOOKING BACK AT 65 YEARS AND LOOKING TOWARDS THE CURE!

Please join with us in celebrating the past 65 years of research and development of programs and treatments for those with CF which have pointed us towards the Path to a Cure that we are on now! YOU have helped to get us to this point!

Here are some of the milestones and amazing advances:

1955: The Cystic Fibrosis Foundation is formed by a group of concerned parents determined to save the lives of their children.

1961: The Foundation establishes an accredited care center network by creating two centers devoted to treating CF.

1965: Richard Weiss coins the term "65 Roses."

1978: The number of Foundation-accredited care centers totals more than 100.

1989: In a historical breakthrough, CFF-supported scientists discover the defective cystic fibrosis CFTR gene and its protein product years before the human genome is mapped. This discovery opens the door to understanding the disease at its most basic level.

1993: The FDA approves Pulmozyme<sup>®</sup>, which is proven to thin the tenacious, sticky mucus in the lungs and is the first drug developed specifically for CF. The time taken to develop Pulmozyme is less than half of the industry average.

1997: The Foundation establishes the Therapeutics Development Program. The FDA approves TOBI<sup>®</sup>, the first aerosolized antibiotic designed for CF, which is proven to reduce hospital stays and improve lung function.

2006: The CF Congressional Caucus is launched and remains one of the largest congressional caucuses of its kind.

2012: The FDA approves ivacaftor (Kalydeco) for a small group of people with CF ages 6 and older. The drug is the first to address the underlying cause of CF and opens exciting new doors to research and development that may lead to a cure for all people living with the disease.

2015: The FDA approves the lumacaftor/ivacaftor (Orkambi<sup>®</sup>) combination drug

2018: The FDA approves tezacaftor/ivacaftor (Symdeko®) combination therapy

2019: The FDA approves the triple-combination modulator elexacaftor/tezacaftor/ivacaftor(Trikafta) for people with CF ages 12 and older who have at least one copy of the F508del mutation, regardless of their other mutation. This historic breakthrough means that for the first time the majority of the CF population could eventually have a highly effective therapy for the underlying cause of their disease.

2020: The Foundation maintains a robust pipeline of potential therapies that target the disease from every angle. The more drugs in the pipeline, the greater the odds of producing successful therapies and a cure for all people with CF.

#### **Important Note on Attendance at Events**

To reduce the risk of getting and spreading germs at CF Foundation-sponsored events, we ask that everyone follow basic best practices by regularly cleaning your hands with soap and water or with an alcohol-based hand gel, covering your cough or sneeze with a tissue or your inner elbow and maintaining a safe 6-foot distance from anyone with a cold or infection. Medical evidence shows that germs may spread among people with CF through direct and indirect contact as well as through droplets that travel short distances when a person coughs or sneezes. These germs

can lead to worsening symptoms and speed decline in lung function. To further help reduce the risk of cross-infection, the Foundation's attendance policy recommends inviting only one person with CF to attend the indoor portion of a Foundation-sponsored event at a specific time. For the outdoor portion, the Foundation recommends that all people with CF maintain a safe 6-foot distance from each other at all times.









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
